Participate in the World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute



As millions across the globe deal with food insecurity, the World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute (WFP MIYI) offers young people an opportunity to be part of the solution. Held May 7 in East Lansing, or by participating from anywhere else using Zoom video/web conference technology, the event seeks to inspire and prepare the next generation of global leaders to end world hunger.

To participate, youth should be in grades 7-12 and register by the March 15 deadline. As part of the registration process, youth are required to prepare a three- to five-page research paper about a developing country and one of 22 key factors that affect food security. At the event, youth present and discuss their papers with other attendees and research and industry experts.

The top performing students at the WFP MIYI will be selected to attend the World Food Prize Global Youth Institute in Des Moines, Iowa, in October. For more information, visit <https://www.canr.msu.edu/wfpmiyi/>. Registration opens February 1 and closes March 15.

Feeding Your Ruminant Workshop – Feb. 21

Join MSU Extension 4-H for the Feeding Your Ruminant Workshop at the Isabella County Commission on Aging, 2200 S. Lincoln Road, Mount Pleasant on Saturday, February 21 from 11:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m. The workshop is recommended for youth ages 8–14, but all youth and adults are welcome. Lunch is included.

This hands-on session will cover basic ruminant anatomy & development, common diseases, basic nutrients and nutrition, hands-on exploration of the ruminant stomach compartments and more.

The presenter is Katie Wilson, a past Isabella County 4-H member who showed dairy feeders and competed in dairy management and judging at the local, state, and national levels. She earned her Bachelor's in Animal Science from MSU (minor in Ag Business), holds a Dairy Management Certificate, and was part of the MSU Dairy Challenge Team that won the National Championship in 2022. Katie currently works at Caledonia Farmers Elevator providing nutrition support in the feed office.


