The club Dairy Beef Project leader will help club members ensure that the required vaccinations are administered in accordance with the vaccination timetable. Active, duly registered St. Joseph County 4-H Dairy Beef Project leaders or veterinarians may only administer vaccinations.

14. All dairy feeder steers must be a purebred or crossbred dairy animal of the following breeds: Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Dutch Belt, Guernsey, Holstein, Jersey, and Lineback.
15. Dairy feeder steers must weigh 175 - 325 lbs. at initial weigh-in at the countywide weigh/tag registration days on June 2 or June 4. Calves that weigh less than 175 lbs. or more than 325 lbs. will not be registered as dairy feeder steers.
16. **Dairy Feeder Steers must gain at least 1.75#/day.** There is no maximum weight at fair.
17. **Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion dairy feeder steers must be sold in the 4-H Large Animal Sale.** All other dairy feeder steers will be sold in the sale or, upon completion of the Animal Removal Authorization form by the exhibitor and one parent/guardian by **8:00 p.m. Tuesday, September 22**, will take the animal home when animals are released from the fair. **Exception:** if showing a dairy market steer, the dairy market steer must be sold and the dairy feeder steer will not be.
18. Dairy feeder steers will be divided into classes at the discretion of the Superintendent and/or MSU Extension.

All dairy market steers must be ear-tagged and registered at the St. Joseph County MSU Extension countywide weigh-in/registration on March 21, 2026, 9:00 - 10:30 a.m. Exhibitors may ear-tag and register two market steers, but may show and sell only one at the fair and one in the Beef Carcass Contest. All animals may be cross-

tagged between family members living in the **SAME** primary household.

3. All dairy market steers must be a purebred or crossbred dairy animal of the following breeds: Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Dutch Belt, Guernsey, Holstein, Jersey, and Lineback.
4. Dairy market steer must weigh a minimum of 1,100 lbs. to compete in this Division.
5. **Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion dairy market steers must sell.** All other dairy market steers will be sold in the sale or, upon completion of the Animal Removal Authorization form by the exhibitor and one parent/guardian by **8:00 p.m. Tuesday, September 22**, will take the animal home when animals are released from the fair.
6. Dairy market steers will be divided into classes at the discretion of the Superintendent and/or MSU Extension.

2. Read and follow "General Exhibitor Livestock Rules" starting on Page 7.
3. Exhibitors will not be allowed to enter or exhibit in this species department if exhibited at another county fair during the current year.
4. All Sheep intended for exhibition at the fair must have a USDA scrapie ear tag in order to be unloaded, weighed in June and housed at the fair. All farm tags excluding scrapie tags must be removed prior to June weigh in. Call MDA to register and receive a premises identification number at 888-565-8626 then call USDA to order official tags at 517-324-5290.
5. **Ownership:** The exhibitor must own all sheep or have joint ownership within a family corporation and/or partnerships of 4-H members with one or more parent, sibling and/or legal guardian. Exhibitors may tag up to four (4) lambs. All sheep may be cross-tagged between family members living in the SAME primary household. **No leasing of lambs is allowed.**
6. **Possession:** Each 4-H member must remain in possession of their animals after tag/weigh-in and must be housed at the

member's home. If an animal is determined to be in violation, that animal will be disqualified unless special permission is granted by the Superintendent and/or MSU Extension prior to moving animal elsewhere.

7. All sheep exhibitors are subject to receiving random farm visits conducted by the species Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent.
8. Lambs will be weighed in at time of unloading, no reweighing.
9. All sheep must be weighed-in on Friday, September 18, 2026, 3:30 - 7:30 p.m. or Saturday, September 19, 2026, 8:00 - 11:00 a.m.
10. Lambs weighing less than the 100 lb. required minimum weight will be ineligible for exhibition and will be sent home at weigh-in. **Exception:** Ewes less than 100 lbs. have the option to declare as Breeding Stock or be taken home.
11. **Pen Bedding:** May use natural/dry mulch or shavings.
12. **Halters** may be used in market lamb classes by exhibitors if desired and approved by Superintendent, and by exhibitors of all ages in breeding stock classes.
13. **Lamb "Check-Off" Fee:** In accordance with the Lamb Promotion, Research & Information Order \$0.007 per pound of live lambs sold will be deducted at the first point of sale.
14. No barn set-up in the sheep barn on Saturday, September 12, 2026, until **all** carcass weigh-ins are completed.
15. Cool, wet towels may be used to prevent overheating of lambs.
16. **Show Order:** Showmanship (oldest to youngest), Cloverbuds, Breeding Stock, Market Wethers, Market Ewes (order rotates annually), Champion Drive, Home Born & Raised, Adult Showmanship.
17. Sheep may only be loaded out on Saturday, September 26, from 11:00 p.m. to midnight or Sunday, September 27, 2026, at 5:30 a.m. All stalls must be cleaned after animals are removed from the fairgrounds.

1. **Required participation by all exhibitors:** All exhibitors exhibiting any type of sheep project must participate in the 4-H Sheep Project Evaluation. A completed evaluation includes an interview with a judge and answering questions from the sheep skill-a-thon. Failure to complete an evaluation will result in sheep project animal(s) disqualification from the show(s) and require the removal of their lambs from the fairgrounds.
2. Sheep Project Evaluations will be conducted on an individual basis on **Sunday, September 20, 2026, starting at 8:00 a.m.** at the stall where the exhibitor's sheep project animal(s) are housed.

1. **Registration and Ear-tagging:** All market and carcass lambs must be ear-tagged and registered at the St. Joseph County MSU Extension countywide weigh-in/registration on June 2 or June 4, 2026, 5:00 - 7:00 p.m. Lambs that are not registered on either of these dates are not eligible to be shown at the fair. Exhibitors may ear-tag and register four market lambs, but may show and sell only two at the fair, and one in the Carcass Lamb Contest if all eligibility requirements are met. All animals may be cross-tagged between family members living in the **SAME** primary household.
2. Male market/carcass lambs must be "wethered" (castrated) by June 1 of the current project year. No rams can be shown as market lambs.
3. Hair samples will be pulled from all market lambs at the time of weigh-in/tagging in June. Hair samples will also be pulled from the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Wethers and Ewes immediately following the Grand Champion Drives.
4. All market lambs must be rough shorn by fair weigh-in.
5. To compete in a 4-H Market Ewes & Wethers class, **lambs must weigh a minimum of 100 lbs.** at weigh in at fair, if the animal does not make the minimum weight, it will be sent home.
6. All market lambs will be consigned to the Large Animal Auction unless the Livestock Removal Authorization Form is submitted to the 4-H office by **Tuesday, September 22, 2026, at 8:00 p.m.** or immediately following the show. **Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion market lambs must sell.**
7. Market lambs will be divided into classes based on fair weigh-in weight at the discretion of MSU Extension and/or Superintendent.

1. A 4-H Home Born & Raised Market Lamb must be both birthed and raised by a 4-H exhibitor on the exhibitor's property, or on a superintendent verified site. (The animal must be raised by the 4-H exhibitor at the place of birth.) Exhibitors may only show one animal in this class.

Division E - Carcass Lamb Contest (Placing premium table = 105a)

1. Entry in this Division is limited to 10 participants. If more than 10 exhibitors submit entry forms, selection of the 10 participants will be based on a combined factor of exhibitor age plus number of years in the project.
2. Completed entry forms must be received in the St. Joseph County MSU Extension office by June 5, 2026 in order to be considered. Applicants will be notified by letter regarding the status of their entry.
3. A member's carcass lamb must be one of the market lambs registered in his/her name.
4. To compete in the 4-H Carcass Sheep class, sheep must weigh a **minimum of 100 lbs.**
5. All lambs entered in the Carcass Lamb Contest must be shorn within two weeks of the weigh-in date or be disqualified.
6. Carcass Lamb weigh-in is at the fairgrounds on **Saturday, September 12, 2026, 10:00 a.m.** Sheep project leaders will coordinate trucking of club carcass lambs.
7. The Carcass Lamb Evaluation will take place on Tuesday, September 15, 2026, at 6:30 p.m. at Bontrager's Custom Meat Processing in Leonidas.
8. Exhibitors participating in this contest are required to attend the Carcass Lamb Evaluation to receive a premium and any associated awards. College students will be exempt from the Carcass Lamb Evaluation if approved by MSU Extension 4-H Program Coordinator by August 15. Any member who fails to meet this requirement will have his/her animal disqualified from the contest.
9. Lamb carcasses must meet the following industry standards in order to be placed in the class: Live weight - 100 lbs.; Loin eye area - 2.0; Back fat thickness - .10 min. Any animal that does not meet all of the above requirements will be disqualified.
10. If a carcass animal is disqualified at the live evaluation, the member can request that the animal be shipped with the rest of the carcass animals for butchering, however, the member will be responsible for all processing expenses and the animal will not be entered into the carcass contest. Exhibitor will still be required to attend hanging evaluation for educational purposes.

2. Read and follow "General Exhibitor Livestock Rules" starting on Page 7.
3. Exhibitors will not be allowed to enter or exhibit in this species department if exhibited at another county fair during the current year.
4. All Goats intended for exhibition must have a USDA scrapie tag on the animal in the ear (small eared goats must have a collared tag) in order to be housed at the fair. **If tattooed, a copy of the paperwork must be given to the superintendent PRIOR to being housed.** Call MDARD to receive a premises identification number (PIN) at 888-565-8626 then call USDA to order official tags at 866-873-2824.
5. Dairy Market Goat project animals are limited to the following breeds: Alpine, Guernsey, LaMancha, Nigerian Dwarf, Nubian, Oberhasli, Saanen, and Toggenberg. Market Goat may be a "cross" between two or more of these breeds.
6. Meat Goats are any goat that is not included in rule #6 above. Example: Boer, Angora, Fainting, etc. or crossbred with a dairy breed.
7. All market and carcass goats must weigh-in on June 2 or June 4, 2026, 5:00 - 7:00 p.m. at countywide goat weigh/tag/registration day at the fairgrounds.
8. Any market goat that does not weigh 60 lbs. on the day of weigh-in at fair will be sent home. **Exception:** does less than 60 lbs. have the option to declare as Breeding Stock. All red neck tags numbers MUST be presented at check-in to be eligible for fair.
9. Check in time at fair for all 4-H goats is Saturday, September 19, 2026, 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.
10. Tying of goats in assigned pens is at the discretion of the exhibitor. Any goat that attempts or does climb or jump over the pen must be tied in the pen once such action is observed.
11. **Ownership:** All breeding stock and market project animals must be owned by the exhibitor or have joint ownership within a family corporation and/or partnerships of 4-H members with one or more parent, sibling and/or legal guardian.
12. Exhibitors must have **primary responsibility** for care and training of their project animal(s) by June 1 of the current project year.
13. No bucks are permitted.
14. Milking on show day is left to the discretion of the exhibitor and leader.
15. Exhibitors should use collars, neck straps or neck chains to aid in controlling the goat.
16. Goats may be either grade or registered, and will compete on an equal basis.
17. **Load-out:** Take-home goats ONLY may leave on Saturday, September 26, from 11:00 p.m. - 12:00 a.m. or Sunday, September 27 at 5:00 a.m. Goats will be released at 5:00 a.m. and must be picked up by **8:00 a.m.** on Sunday, September 27, 2026. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning their pens after the animals leave.

18. Exhibitor dress code consists of dark pants and dress shirt of exhibitor's choice. No T-shirts. Exhibitors **MUST** wear dark colored closed toe footwear. Dairy exhibitors may choose to wear white pants and a white shirt.
19. All goat pens must be cleaned down to the cement and re-bedded with fresh **pine shavings only** a minimum of two times during the fair week. Suggested cleaning days are Tuesday and Thursday mornings.
20. Dairy goats and meat goats will show in separate rings with separate judges, but will run the same show order: Open Class, Breeding Stock, Pet Class, Showmanship (oldest to youngest), Cloverbuds, Market, County Bred & Born.
21. No barn set-up in any goat barn on Saturday, September 12, 2026 until all carcass weigh-ins are completed.

1. **Required participation by all exhibitors:** All exhibitors exhibiting any type of goat project must participate in the 4-H Goat Project Evaluation. A completed evaluation includes an interview with a judge and answering questions from the goat skill-a-thon. Failure to complete an evaluation will result in their goat project animal(s) disqualification from the show(s) and require the removal of their goats from the fairgrounds.

**Division C - Market Goats
(Placing premium table = 102)**

1. Market goats must have milk teeth present at fair check-in and are suggested to be born on December 1, 2025 or after. Does and/or wethers are eligible for market class.
2. **Registration and Ear-tagging:** All market and carcass goats must be ear-tagged and registered at the St. Joseph County MSU Extension countywide weigh-in/registration on June 2 or June 4, 2026, 5:00 - 7:00 p.m. Goats that are not registered on either of these dates are not eligible to be shown at the fair. Exhibitors may ear-tag and register three market goats, but may show and sell only two at the fair, and one in the Carcass Goat Contest if all eligibility requirements are met. All animals may be cross-tagged between family members living in the SAME primary household.
3. All market goats MUST have a scrapie tag in the ear, or on the collar for earless goats only, at the June weigh-in to be eligible for fair.
4. Male market goats must be "wethered" (castrated) by June 1 of the current project year. The only methods of castration that will be accepted are surgical cut or banding.
5. All market goats must be dehorned and castrated by June 1. Market goats may be allowed with a maximum one-half (½) inch horn/scur with the discretion of superintendent and assistant superintendent at fair check-in.
6. Market goats will be divided into classes based on fair weigh-in weight at the discretion of the Superintendent and/or MSU Extension.
7. To compete in a 4-H Market Goat class, **goats must weigh a minimum of 60 lbs. at weigh in at fair**, if the animal does not make the minimum weight, it will be sent home.
8. Exhibitors showing two individual goats will sell their higher placing goat in the Small Animal Sale. The second animal will be sold at support price or can be taken home upon completion of the Livestock Removal Authorization form. The form must be completed and returned to the 4-H office **by 8:00 p.m. on Monday, September 21, 2026. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion goats must sell.** In the event both goats place as Dairy/Meat Grand Champion or Reserve Grand Champion both animals must be sold in the 4-H Small Animal Sale.

- Exhibitors will not be allowed to enter or exhibit in this species department if exhibited at another county fair during the current year.
- Ownership:** The exhibitor must own all swine or have joint ownership within a family corporation and/or partnerships of 4-H members with one or more parent, sibling, and/or legal guardian.
- Registration and Ear-tagging:** All market and carcass hogs must be ear-tagged and registered with the St. Joseph County MSU Extension on Wednesday, June 3, 2026 or Thursday, June 4, 5:00 - 7:30 p.m. at the fairgrounds. Hogs that are not registered with the MSU Extension office are not eligible to be shown at the fair. Exhibitors may ear-tag and register four hogs, but may show and sell only two at the fair, and one in the Carcass Hog Contest if all eligibility requirements are met. All animals may be cross-tagged between family members living in the **SAME** primary household.
- Ear Tags:** St. Joseph County Fair 4-H tags will be used for identification. In accordance with **state law, all exhibition hogs must also have an official form of ID**, such as an 840 or NUES tag. If they do not already have official ID when purchased, it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure hogs are tagged with an official ID tag by the date of tagging. A premises identification number (PIN) is required to purchase tags. Exhibitors can call MDARD at 888-565-8626 to obtain a PIN.

7. MSU Extension staff, 4-H Swine Superintendent or Assistant Superintendents, will handle all shipping arrangements for market hogs to processing. No private trucking of market hogs is allowed.
8. **Swine Sale “Check-Off” Fee:** In accordance with the National Pork Promotion, Research and Consumer Information Act; 0.35% (.0035) of the sale value will be deducted at the first point of sale.
9. **Weigh-In Process:** Hogs must be delivered to the fair on Friday, September 18, 2026, 3:30 - 7:30 pm **or** Saturday, September 19, 2026 8:00 - 11:00 am. Weigh-in will take place at time of unloading. Hogs can be weighed only once - NO reweighing. The exhibitor, or immediate family member must accompany their market hogs through the weigh-in process. Hogs must be **clean and tags legible** or they will be turned away until they are clean. All hogs must have an 840 or NUES tag in place to be unloaded.
10. Hogs weighing less than 230 lbs. **or** more than 320 lbs. are disqualified and will be sent home immediately.
11. **Show Equipment:** Swine Project member may take into the show arena building, including the time in a holding pen, a brush and show instrument. This rule covers the entire time the member is in the show arena. The Swine Department will furnish water bottles to be put in each holding pen for the use of each showman. These provided water bottles must remain in the holding pen area only.
12. The judge and volunteers assisting with the 4-H Swine Show are the only people allowed in the show ring and holding pen area during the show. **Parents may not accompany their child.**
13. **Club Wash Rack/Runway Duty:** Each 4-H Swine Project club will be assigned specific wash rack(s) to keep clean during the week. ANYONE can use the wash racks. Clubs will be responsible for their assigned wash rack(s) to clean and will be checked daily. **Absolutely no feeding of hogs or cleaning of equipment in the wash rack!**
14. All pigs that are clipped must have at least 3/8 in. of hair. There will be **no painting** allowed during the grooming and fitting process.
15. Swine pens **MUST** be stripped of all bedding and replaced with fresh bedding EACH morning. **Only pine shavings may be used as bedding.** Cleaning and feeding times are as follows: morning, 6:00 - 8:00 a.m. and evenings, 6:00 - 8:00 p.m.
16. All market hogs will be consigned to the Large Animal Auction unless the Livestock Removal Authorization Form is submitted to the 4-H office by **Monday, September 21, 2026, at 8:00 p.m. The Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Barrow, Gilt, and Purebred must be consigned to the 4-H Large Animal Sale.**
17. **Show Order:** Showmanship (oldest to youngest), Market Gilts, Market Barrows, Cloverbuds, Grand Champion Drive - Gilts, Grand Champion Drive – Barrows.
18. **Load-out:** All hogs designated for take-home will have an optional load-out on Saturday, September 26, from 11:00 p.m. to midnight. All hogs will be released at 5:30 a.m. and must be picked up by **10:00 a.m.** on Sunday, September 27. **Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning their pens after the animals leave.**

5. Live Hog weigh-in will take place on **Saturday, September 12, 2026, at 10:00 a.m.** at the fairgrounds.
6. The Carcass Hog Evaluation will take place on Tuesday, September 15, 2026, at 6:00 p.m. at Bontrager's Custom Meat Processing in Leonidas.
7. Exhibitors participating in this contest are required to attend the Carcass Hog Evaluation to receive a premium and any associated awards. College students will be exempt from the Carcass Hog Evaluation **if** approved by MSU Extension 4-H Program Coordinator by August 15. Any member who fails to meet this requirement will have his/her animal disqualified from the contest.
8. Carcass evaluation judging criteria will include carcass score and quality (color, texture and exudation). Severe cases of PSE will be disqualified based on judge's discretion.

Breeding stock (chickens, ducks and geese) and pigeons will also be leg-banded on Sunday, August 23, 2026, or Monday, August 24, 2026, 4:00 - 7:00 p.m. at the fairgrounds. Pullorum testing will be available at the wing/leg banding. Exhibitor may register up to two (2) birds for each breeding stock class.
7. Breeding stock poultry age (including chickens, ducks and geese) is defined as: **A "young" bird is one hatched from previous fair, October 1 to current fair September 30. A "mature" bird is one that is 12 months old or older.**
8. **Ownership:** All breeding stock and market poultry must be owned by the exhibitor or have joint ownership within a family corporation and/or partnerships of 4-H members with one or more parent, sibling, and/or legal guardian. Cross-tagging is acceptable among immediate family members only.
